Lockdown Policy

We now have a lockdown policy in place, which the staff team have all been trained on.

A lockdown policy is to safeguard all in the same way that we have a fire/evacuation policy and procedure. A lockdown is activated when the building needs to be secured due to an external threat; this can be a range of things, including a fire in the local vicinity, a dangerous dog on the loose or an intruder on site.

In the last week of term, I will hold a whole school assembly to talk to the children about the procedure and reassure them that practising a lockdown is so we know what to do in the very small chance that we will need to lockdown the school for real. We will then have a drill on the Wednesday morning. We will then practise our lockdown termly, in the same way we have a termly fire drill.

I encourage all parents to read through the policy and I welcome any queries you may have. We are aware of individual children who are likely to find the drill challenging; please be assured these children have been planned for.
