Anti-Bullying Week

Next week is national Anti-Bullying week. The theme for this year is 'United Against Bullying'. We are starting the week off with an 'odd socks day' on Monday to celebrate how we are all unique. There is no donation for this event; it's about raising awareness.

Throughout the week the children will be developing their understand of what is and isn't bullying; how our school values create a safe school environment; making pledges about how we are 'United Against Bullying' and reinforcing the support mechanisms in place should bullying behaviour occur.

Our staff training this week looked at what the 4 key elements of bullying behaviour are: hurtful, repeated, intentional & imbalanced power. This means that staff can support children in understanding the difference between bullying and relational conflict.
