### Calling to Report your Child Absent

On the rare occasion that you may need to leave an absence message because your child is ill, please could you be specific about what is the matter. If school receives a message that says 'unwell', 'ill' or 'sick', Mrs Morley is required to call you back to find out what the matter is. We also ask that if you do need to call school to report absence, you do so before the school day has begun; it is useful information for the staff before officially beginning the school day. On our website homepage, we set-up the 'contact Mrs Pardon function' some time ago. It enables children to contact me directly if they are worried or concerned about something. The message goes directly to my email inbox, meaning that the concern is in the child's words and the matter can be dealt with appropriately.

For some children, who find it difficult to initiate a conversation with an adult about what is troubling them, this option of sharing concerns suits them well as it means an adult in school can have an open conversation that the child may not know the words or have the confidence to start the conversation.

As a parent, you may wish to encourage your child to share with me what is troubling them using this

function.

We also share with children that they can contact me, if they don't feel safe outside of school as part of my job is to keep children safe in and out of school.

### Pupil Premium Eligibility

Pupil Premium Funding is additional funding available to schools to further support providing high quality education for all children and particularly those pupils who are 'disadvantaged'. At our school, we make 20% of that funding available to the parent to spend on 'wider support strategies' to support their child being engaged in education.
